





Transformation of the Arctic

- Shipping and maritime transportation is a \$500 billion dollar industry;
- Approximately 90% of all commodities globally are transported by ships;
- Climate change and related reductions in sea ice are facilitating new opportunities for shipping through the Canadian Arctic;
- Traffic through the Northwest Passage has tripled over the past decade;
- Canada is in an excellent position to be a global leader in Arctic oceans governance and development.
- Canadian scientists should be leading science initiatives focused on shipping in our Arctic waters

Our Vision

To co-develop a world-class research network to undertake science that supports policy and decision-making for oceans governance, sustainable shipping and economic development, while training the next generation of Arctic marine and shipping research experts.

To **leverage the assets** of such a network (ships, people, and coastal infrastructure) to improve ocean, ice, and atmospheric observations along Arctic shipping routes.

To conduct university-based science that supports:

- Decision-makers to establish evidence-based policy and to position Canada as a global leader in Arctic oceans and shipping governance;
- **Industry** to operate more efficiently and in a safer environment; and
- Arctic communities to mitigate local impacts and enhance economic opportunities.
