- A national cumulative effects assessment framework for marine shipping
- Data and knowledge amalgamation (environmental, cultural, Indigenous use, vessel activities)
- Undertake regional cumulative effects assessments
- Regionally specific tools that can be applied to existing vessel movements/future project developments

- <u>Cambridge Bay</u> Waterway Safety Committee Terms of Reference
- Bay of Fundy Protocol agreement being developed
- <u>South Coast BC</u> initiating work with Indigenous groups

Federal / Provincial Agreement

 <u>St. Lawrence</u> - TC/Quebec reached an agreement for co-planning and co-developing the regional assessment in collaboration with Indigenous groups
